1. Group Study Exchange. From January 9 to February 8, 1988, Ed Hoke served as a member of a Rotary International Group Study Exchange team from District 651 to District 310 in Uttar Pradesh, India. Cultural exchange for peace and mutual understanding is the focus of the GSE program which is sponsored by Rotary International.
