Did You Know?

President Barack Obama signed an omnibus appropriations bill in January that provides \$205 million to support polio eradication in 2014, through the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and U. S. Agency for International Development. The largest government donor to polio eradication, the U.S. has contributed more than \$2.3 billion since the mid-1980s, when 125 countries were polio endemic and the disease afflicted 350,000 people annually.

In addition to contributing more than \$1.2 billion to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI), Rotary has helped secure over \$9 billion from donor governments since the initiative was launched in 1988.

SIUC Engineering: Leadership Development Program (LDP)

Program representatives Leah Westjohn and Matthew Reichers shared information and first-person perspectives on the LDP and similar programs in the SIUC College of Engineering. Leah is president of Engineering Student Council; Matthew is president of the LDP.

The LDP mission statement:

Through teamwork, we push harder, faster, and further than anyone thought possible, achieving world-class results.

Proof of success:

- Before graduation, 85% of LDP graduates have career offers.
- Two Outstanding Student Leadership Awards.
- GPA of 3.3 for LDP graduates.

The LDP is an intensive training program to produce highly sought-after graduates, using industrial projects, applied leadership experience, seminar instruction, peer mentoring, and personal coaching. The program includes professional internships and scholarship funding opportunities.

The program was founded in 2006 by Dick Blaudow, an SIUC engineering alumnus and CEO of Advanced Technology Services based out of Peoria, Illinois. Blaudow with his wife, Brigitte, established the program as a way to help develop the next generation of America's technical leaders.
