- ★ To develop life skills including self development, time management, and personal finances.
- ★ To recognize the dignity and value of all useful occupations as opportunities to serve society.
- ★ To provide opportunities for gaining increased knowledge and understanding of community, national, and world affairs.
- ★ To open avenues of avenues of personal and group action leading to the advancement of international understanding and goodwill toward all peoples.

ABCs of The Rotary Foundation

George Waring presented an eye-popping PowerPoint to introduce Foundation Month and provide a highly informative view of The Rotary Foundation and its programs. George makes this presentation to clubs across the region in his role as a key member of the district's Foundation committee.

Waring traced the origins and early history of The Rotary Foundation as a backdrop. Clarifying the distinction between dues and donations, he then progressed into the programs structure of the foundation. He distinguished between the Annual Fund and the Endowment Fund (formerly the Annual Programs Fund and the Permanent Fund).

He carefully explained the "SHARE" system and the various pathways for allocating donations. For example, donations to the Annual Fund are invested for three years, then a major portion is returned to districts and clubs, Only the interest gained from these investments is allocated for fund administration. Thus, 100 percent of donations is applied to the "good works" that are the initiating purpose of The Rotary Foundation and Rotary International.

Such District Designated Funds (DDF) are available in three major program areas: district grants, global grants, and packaged grants.

- ◆ District grants are available short-term use by clubs and districts as determined by the clubs and districts.
- ◆ Global grants are for longer-term purposes with sustainable characteristics; these grants have a minimum size of \$30,000.
- ◆ Packaged grants support pre-designed projects and activities of a long-term, sustainable nature, typically with non-Rotarian strategic partners; yet, Rotarians participate directly in implementation.
